

EMBROIDERY: SATIN STITCH

A stitch that covers a larger area with the stitching thread. Can be used to create many shapes. Can use one color, or visually mix one or more colors. (See diagrams at the end of the instruction sheet.)

- 1. Follow the Sewing Set-Up Instructions to prepare your needle and thread for sewing.
- 2. See image below; this is an example of what the finished stitching will look like. The shape for this example is abstract but can be made into other shapes as well.



3. In the following images the stitch lines are marked with arrows so you can see the direction of the stitching. Come up through the fabric at the beginning of the arrow, and stich down through the fabric at the pointed end of the arrow:





4. Pull the thread through to create one long stitch. Repeat to create multiple long stitches next to each other. Vary the length of the stitches to create the shape.





5. After stitching the last stitch, turn embroidery hoop to the backside and finish with the knot from the Finishing Instruction sheet.
